Sustainable Development Minister opens Nunavut Development Corporation office in Rankin Inlet

IQALUIT, Nunavut (December 2, 1999) – Sustainable Development Minister Peter Kilabuk officially opened the new Nunavut Development Corporation office in Rankin Inlet.

"I was pleased to be able to open the Nunavut Development Corporation office," Minister Kilabuk said. "I look forward to working with the Corporation board members to strengthen the operations of the Corporation and to examine new opportunities for Nunavummiut."

During the October session of the Legislative Assembly, Minister Kilabuk announced the establishment of the Corporation and the appointment of its seven board members. Earlier this year, Minister Kilabuk announced the appointment of John Hickes of Rankin Inlet as the Corporation's first president. The board is expected to hold its first meeting in Rankin Inlet in early January.

The Board is responsible for administering the Nunavut Development Corporation Act. The Corporation currently operates nine businesses in seven Nunavut communities, largely in the arts and crafts and meat and fish processing sectors. The Corporation is also responsible for identifying new investment opportunities in communities to promote economic growth and diversification.
