Nunavut Students Excel at Canadian Skills Competition

IQALUIT, Nunavut (**June 30, 2005**) – Nunavut students have brought home gold and silver medals from the tenth annual Canadian Skills Competition.

More than 350 secondary and post secondary students from across Canada competed in 20 trade and technological competitions. Forty practical challenges showcased their technical and leadership abilities in the areas of communications, construction trades, employability skills, manufacturing, transportation and services.

The Nunavut students teamed up with the Northwest Territories. The Nunavut students came away from the competition with eight medals, as well as gaining the experience of participating in a national competition.

The success of the team reflects positively on territorial educational institutions and the trade industry. Twenty-four youth from across NWT and Nunavut participated in 20 trades and technological competitions.

Of the 24 students, six were from Nunavut – five secondary and one post secondary:
