If you are scheduled for a medical travel appointment to a health facility in the south, there are a few things you need to remember so your experience is hassle-free.

Don't forget:

- Your personal Government of Nunavut issued identification or passport;
- Your Nunavut health card;
- To attend all of your scheduled appointments;
- Money for unexpected expenses like taxi fares, food, and prescriptions; and
- To pack a suitcase with enough clothing and personal items, like medications, toothbrush, etc. to last a few days.
