Grise Fiord Residents Celebrate Opening of Hamlet Office Complex

June 20, 2014 Grise Fiord, Nunavut

Residents and government officials today celebrated the opening of the Grise Fiord Hamlet Office Complex. Nunavut's smallest community, with a population of less than 150, will benefit from this multi-purpose facility, which is now equipped to address the multiple program and service needs of the community.

The new facility includes hamlet offices for staff members, the Iviq Hunters and Trappers Organization, and the Qikiqtani Inuit Association, as well as a gymnasium and a much-anticipated community hall—the first of its kind in Grise Fiord.

- The governments of Canada and Nunavut have jointly committed \$11.55 million through the Provincial-Territorial Base Fund toward the eligible costs of this initiative.
- The Provincial-Territorial Base Fund is part of the 2007 Building Canada Plan and is designed to address core infrastructure priorities in each jurisdiction.
