## Medical travel identification requirements

This is a reminder that any medical travel client or escort must have a health care card, along with two pieces of identification (ID) to check-in at airports and to board an airplane. One piece of ID must include a photo. Photo ID can be one of the following:

- passport
- driver's licence
- Nunavut general identification certificate

When travelling, children under the age of 12 are required to have a piece of identification, but do not require a photo ID.

To request your photo ID, visit your local Department of Economic Development and Transportation licence office. If your community does not have a licence office, you can contact your hamlet office, or visit the Government Liaison Office (GLO) in your community for help. A complete GLO list is available here:
