Food recalls due to Hepatitis A

August 4, 2021

Nunavut-wide

The Department of Health is warning about a food recall issued by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) due to possible *Hepatitis A* contamination.

Nature's Touch Frozen Food Inc. is recalling various **frozen mangoes** from the marketplace due to possible *Hepatitis A* contamination. Consumers should not consume the recalled products described below.

This recalled product should be thrown out or returned to the location where it was purchased.

Food contaminated with *Hepatitis A* virus may not look or smell spoiled but can still cause sickness. Short-term symptoms can include fever, rapid weight loss, nausea and abdominal pain followed by jaundice (yellowing of the skin or whites of the eyes). The disease varies from a mild illness lasting one to two weeks to a severe disease lasting several months. Severe illness from *Hepatitis A* infection is rare. If you think you became sick from consuming a recalled product, call your local health centre.
