Confirmed COVID-19 case in Iqaluit

Iqaluit, Nunavut (December 4, 2021) – Dr. Michael Patterson, Nunavut's Chief Public Health Officer, today announced a positive case of COVID-19 in Iqaluit.

“On December 3, an individual who recently returned from travel in Southern Canada tested positive for COVID-19,” said Dr. Patterson. “The individual is isolating and contact tracing is on-going. The risk for transmission is considered low and there is no need to increase public health measures at this time.”

Any unvaccinated travellers on Canadian North's December 2 Flight 5T-103 from Ottawa to Iqaluit who were seated in rows 21 to 27 are advised to immediately isolate until December 16. Any vaccinated passengers in those rows should self-monitor for symptoms until December 16.

The Department of Health will continue to monitor the situation and provide updates as needed. The positive sample will be sent to a laboratory in Southern Canada to identify the variant.

Anyone who develops COVID-19 symptoms is advised to call the COVID hotline at 1-888-975-8601 between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. EST, or notify their community health centre right away by telephone. Please do not go to the health centre in person.

COVID-19 vaccines and boosters are available to all Nunavummiut aged five and older. Contact your health centre or Iqaluit Public Health to make an appointment.
