Transforming Nunavut's Child Day Care Act

The Department of Education is developing new early learning and child care legislation to foster high-quality, Inuit-centred early learning and child care programs that are accessible, affordable, inclusive, and focused on the safety and well-being of children.

The current <u>Child Day Care Act</u> was inherited from the Northwest Territories and has not been updated since 1988. The new legislation needs to reflect Nunavut's vision for early learning and child care programs and services, and build on Inuit culture and languages. Your feedback is important to ensure its success.

The Department of Education has created several ways for Nunavummiut to provide feedback:
