Changes to the Nunavut Coroners Act

Start Date: August 30, 2024 End Date: September 6, 2024 Nunavut-wide

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The Department of Justice is advising Nunavummiut of upcoming changes to the <u>Nunavut Coroners Act</u> following recent amendments by the Legislative Assembly.

These changes come into effect on August 31, 2024, and include:

- New requirements to report deaths to the coroner:
 - The Director of Child and Family Services must report any death of a child or youth under their care or supervision.
 - The Public Guardian and private guardians must report the death of a person under a Guardianship Order.
 - The RCMP must report any death involving an on-duty police officer.
- Requiring a mandatory inquest for deaths involving an on-duty police officer.
- Allowing coroners to investigate a death without a body if it has been destroyed, has been found but cannot be recovered, or has been removed from the territory.
- Expanding the prohibition against interfering with a body to the immediate surroundings and associated wreckage unless doing so is needed to preserve the body, or to protect health or safety, or the action is taken by police.
