## New Chief Justice for the Nunavut Court of Justice

**Iqaluit, Nunavut (November 29, 2024)** – Premier P.J. Akeeagok and Justice Minister David Akeeagok today expressed their congratulations to the Hon. Susan Cooper on her appointment as the new chief justice of the Nunavut Court of Justice by Prime Minister Justin Trudeau.
