Participating students will get hands-on experience in various professions as they consider potential career paths. Parents and guardians can showcase their workplace and allow their kids to observe them in a real work environment.

This year's theme is *Breaking Barriers, Transforming Communities*. We hope employers wholeheartedly welcome students into their workplace, and recognize that the student's career path directly contributes to the communities they live and work in.

- Learn essential skills to thrive in the workplace.
- Discover a range of career options.
