World Contraception Day 2024

September 26, 2024, is World Contraception Day, which focuses on a vision where every pregnancy is planned. This day is an opportunity to raise awareness about the different types of contraception methods available and to help individuals make informed choices about their sexual and reproductive health.

Today, we would like to promote awareness and open discussion about contraception. It is essential to recognize the significance of providing a range of contraceptive options for Nunavummiut.

Contraceptive methods range from hormonal options and barrier methods to intrauterine devices (IUD) and implants. Each method comes with its own set of benefits and potential risks, and by offering options, every individual can make an informed decision about what best suits their preferences and needs.

Some of the most common contraceptive methods are:

- External and internal condoms.
- An IUD (a device placed inside the uterus).
- Needle (an injection of birth control hormones).
- Birth control pill.
- Patch (that delivers birth control hormones through the skin).
- Ring (that delivers birth control hormones intravaginally).

Most types of birth control are free for Nunavut Inuit who are covered under non-insured health benefits.
