The Nunavut Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) and the Department of Community Services' Nunavut emergency management division (NEM) extend their thoughts to those impacted by the recent mass shooting in Tumbler Ridge, B.C.

The safety and wellbeing of Nunavummiut remain a shared priority. In Nunavut, law enforcement and emergency management partners work together every day to support community safety and coordinate responses across the territory.

If an emergency occurs in your community, the RCMP and NEM will share public safety information using trusted tools, including the Alert Ready system, which delivers emergency alerts directly to mobile devices and broadcasters. The system is tested twice a year to ensure it functions properly. In an emergency, it is important to follow the instructions provided in the alert.
