Listeria contamination linked to various brands of meat products

Nunavut-wide

The Department of Health is warning about a food recall issued by the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) due to possible *Listeria monocytogenes* contamination linked to various brands of meat products.

Food contaminated with Listeria may not look, smell or taste spoiled, but it can still make you sick. Symptoms can include nausea, vomiting, fever, muscle aches, severe headaches and a stiff neck. Elders, pregnant women and people with weakened immune systems are at higher risk of becoming seriously ill. Pregnant people may have only mild flu-like symptoms, but the infection can cause serious complications for their
