Inuit societal values committee for Nunavut Corrections

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Are you passionate about sharing Inuit societal values and perspectives? Help shape the justice system by improving cultural programming and practices within Nunavut's correctional system.

The Department of Justice is looking for up to nine individuals from across Nunavut to serve on the Inuit societal values committee established under the [Corrections Act](#). The committee has spaces for representatives from all three regions: Kitikmeot, Kivalliq and Qikiqtani, and at least two committee spaces are reserved for Elders.

The committee's role is to help ensure that Inuit perspectives, Inuit societal values, and traditional knowledge are integrated into Nunavut's correctional system, including programming for correctional clients. In particular, the committee will:

- recommend policies and practices that strengthen Inuit cultural integration in corrections;
- review feedback and propose new or revised correctional programs to better reflect Inuit values and knowledge; and
- give advice to the director of corrections and the independent investigations officer.

Committee members will receive an honorarium and have all necessary travel and accommodation expenses covered for activities related to the committee.
